

## Profiles on Courage Research Project

### Introduction

Students will research different personalities from the Soviet Jewry movement. They will determine what motivated them, what happened to them, and what happened to them after the movement ended.

### Objectives

At the end of the lesson, students will be able to describe and/or depict a person who was active in the Soviet Jewry movement through the creation of a project or presentation.

Big Ideas	Jews are responsible for one another (solidarity).
	You can make a difference.
Content	To explain the Jewish values that led Jewish people to fight for Soviet Jewish rights.
	To relate to the historical events that led to freedom for Soviet Jews.
Skills	To build a civic engagement plan.
	To contribute to causes relating to (Jewish/all) human freedom.
Meaning	To reflect on your obligation to help (Jewish/all) people in need.
	To reflect on the power of a common (Jewish) voice.

### Essential Question:

- What motivated the person to work on behalf of the Jews in the former Soviet Union?
- What motivated you to protest against the Soviet Government?
- What did you do specifically for the movement? What was it like? How did you feel throughout your involvement?
- What were the long-term outcomes for others? For you?

**Duration:** 4-5 classes for research, rehearsal/recording and presentation
